



Dish Soap Puck

Steps to Use

- **Prepare Your Dishes:** They can be soaking in water or just rinsed after being scraped clean.
- **Wet Your Cleaning Tool:** Take your dish sponge, brush, or cloth and wet it under running water. This helps to create a lather when you rub it against the soap puck.
- **Lather the Soap:** Rub the wet sponge or brush directly on the dish soap puck, 3 or 4 times. Use a circular motion to build up a good lather. Squeeze the sponge/cloth to create suds.
- **Wash Your Dishes:** With the lathered sponge/brush/cloth, scrub your dishes as you normally would, keeping it out of the water your dishes may be soaking in.
- **Rinse Thoroughly** after scrubbing.
- **Store Soap Puck in a dry place for drainage & airflow, like a soap dish to prolong its life.**

What else can you use a dish soap puck for other than handwashing dishes?

This is a short list.

- **Pre-treating laundry stains.** Wet the garment, rub the soap puck on it & rub garment together on itself, like you would to remove any other stain.
- **Cleaning glass-top stoves.** A lathered up a natural loofa sponge, it works great.
- **Cleaning sinks and bathtubs.** Using a lathered up natural loofa sponge does the trick.
- **Removing stickers and labels from jars.** Peel off as much as you can, then fill a large bowl or your sink with warm water and rub the dish soap puck in your hands under the water to get it sudsy. Let the jars soak in the water, then lather up a loofah or dish brush to get any remaining residue off.
- **Cleaning eyeglasses.** Run your fingers under warm water, rub them on the dish soap puck - just a little. Then use your soapy fingers to clean the glasses. Once they're all cleaned, rinse them off with warm water, then dry them.

Soap Dish Care Instructions

To get the most out of your natural wood soap dish:

Option 1: Rotate Between Two Dishes

Using soap dishes in pairs can significantly extend their lifespan.

- Use one dish for 2-3 weeks
- Wipe clean & let it dry completely
- Switch to the 2nd dish while the first one rests

This rotation helps prevent mold, mildew & soap scum, preserving both your soap & soap dish.

Option 2: Single Dish Maintenance

- Every 3-4 weeks, wipe it clean & let it dry overnight
- Return to use the following day

Consistent care keeps your soap dish looking great & performing well for the long haul.



How To Use A Shampoo Bar

1. Wet your hair and soap, the warmer the water the better but works in any temperature.
2. Start a lather on the soap by rubbing it in your hands.
3. Some choose to just lather it in their hands and put it on their head that way (only needs to go on the head, not all the way down to the ends, if you have long hair).
4. I start a lather in my hands but then rub the bar on my head (top, back and sides) just a couple, 3 times and then massage my head, the lather will grow quite a bit.
5. Rinse, I find just one wash makes your hair very clean and I don't have to use a conditioner every time.
